The Year of the Word 'The God Who Speaks'

Jerome took on the work of translating the bible into Latin after he had been charged by Pope Damascus I to 'revise' the Vetus Latina ("Old Latin") Gospels which were then in use in the church. He translated the Old Testament after having learned, Hebrew, from the Hebrew bible; the Psalms he translated from the Greek Septuagint (this is a reason why you will see two Psalm numbers by the Psalms in your missal!); the Gospels were translated from their Greek manuscripts and somebody, other than Jerome, added the epistles. The Vulgate, as a whole, is ascribed to the work of Jerome and he certainly had the major input.

Saint of the Week S. Peter Canisius

Peter was born to wealthy parents however,

his mother died shortly after his birth. He earned his Masters degree at the age of 19, and became a Catholic Priest soon after. He renewed the Catholic Church with the help of the Holy Emperor and made many friends in the process.

He was also a devoted Scholar of his day and founded many universities. One was named after him and is still there today, although it is among the elite and you need the highest grades to get in.

Peter was also an author and was known to be called the second Apostle of Germany; He died aged 78.
