## Saint of the Week

### S. Charles Borromeo

Charles was born into a wealthy family and his uncle was a  
Pope. His uncle made him his secretary, administrator, and  
even a cardinal; although not yet a priest.  
Charles was ordained when he was just 25 years old and two  
months later he was made a Bishop.

Charles became known for founding Seminaries, and places for  
children to learn the Christian doctrine. He gave away his  
inheritance to feed thousands during the famines, and he  
nursed many others during the plague. This and his ongoing  
efforts to reform the Church took its toll, and he died aged  
46 years old.
